Integrated Knowledge Translation at CIHR: An Update

Abstract:

Integrated knowledge translation means researchers and knowledge-users working together to shape the research questions; interpret the study findings and craft messaging around them and move the research results into practice. In theory, this should increase the chance that the research will be moved into practice and actually have an impact. At CIHR, integrated knowledge translation grants require researchers and knowledge-users to be co-applicants. There have been changes to and evaluations of these programs at CIHR since Ian Graham last addressed the Participatory Research @ Lunch group in January of 2008. Jacqueline Tetroe, Senior Advisor in the Knowledge Translation and Public Outreach Portfolio at CIHR will bring you up to date on what we have been working on over the past three years.
